MAKE A BOOKING

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Visit **www.capetownfringe.co.za** or go through this programme and decide what you'd like to see. Then you have a couple of ways in which to make sure your Cape Town Fringe experience is awesome.

- You can go to www.capetownfringe.co.za or download our nifty Cape Town Fringe App and shop to your heart's content, or if you prefer a friendly voice on the other end of a phone line, you can call 0860 002 004 and book your tickets with one of our call centre operators. You can pay using credit card or by EFT.
- Or you can email or fax your list of selected shows to boxoffice@capetownfringe.co.za or 086 233 2122 and our Box Office team will make your bookings for you. They'll communicate with you if there are any clashes, cancellations, sold out shows, or changes to your schedule.
- School or Group Bookings must be emailed or faxed

 our Box Office Manager will arrange these bookings
 and guide you through the process, ensuring that the
 appropriate discount is allocated.
- Cash and card bookings can be made in person at the Fringe Box Office in the City Hall from 21 September. The Box Office will be open from 2pm on weekdays and from 10am on Saturday and Sundays during the Fringe.

If shows are not sold out, tickets will also be available at the door 30 minutes prior to the start times of performances outside the City Hall (for shows in the City Hall, you can purchase tickets at the Box Office Express Till). No discounted tickets can be sold at the door – so if you're bringing granny and the kids, its best to pre-book and take advantage of the pensioner and the student discounts. **Credit / debit cards cannot be used for tickets purchased at the door - it's cash only.**

HOW DO I GET MY TICKETS?

If you have booked online or through our call centre, you can pick up your tickets from our Box Office on the first floor of the City Hall or you can print your tickets at home and bring the printed-out tickets to the venues where they'll be scanned.

Ticket collections at the Box Office:

If you made an online booking, using your **credit card**, swipe your card at the **self-service kiosks** in the City Hall Box Office, and your tickets will automatically be printed. The cashiers will also be able to print out your tickets for you if you prefer the personal touch. HOW TO BOOK! Booking opens on 22 August 2016

HOW DO I GET MY TICKETS? (CONTINUED...)

If you booked by **phone, fax or email**, or if you paid **online by EFT**, you will need the reference number you were given when you made your booking – print out your confirmation email and give it to the cashier on duty and they will print out your tickets for you.

VISITORS WITH A DISABILITY

Wheelchairs can be accommodated at most venues – but there are upstairs venues. Please contact the **Box Office Manager** on **0860 002 004** who will discuss your requirements and arrange assistance for you where necessary.

REFUNDS

- Refunds for Cape Town Fringe events will be made only in the event of programme alterations or cancellations. The Cape Town Fringe cannot make other refunds or undertake to resell or exchange tickets.
- The Fringe organisers cannot be held responsible if a production runs longer than the advertised duration. This information is supplied by the performers and is published as a guide. Allow at least 15 minutes between performances in the City Hall and take into account travel times when making your bookings.
- We regret that we cannot refund tickets for late arrivals at performances. Please arrive at least 10 minutes before the show is scheduled to begin.

TICKET PRICES & BOX OFFICE SPECIALS

Discounts are available for most shows on the Cape Town Fringe including concessions for children, learners and students, pensioners, and group bookings (bookings of 10 or more tickets to a performance).

- Students and scholars may be asked to prove their eligibility by producing a student card or Identity document (learners). **Pensioners** (retired and 65+) should have their pensioner's card or ID book on them in case they are asked for it.
- Group discounts will automatically be applied on any booking of 10 tickets or more (whether booking online or in person) if a production has offered this discount.
- Buy One Get One Free discounts are offered to selected performances. To qualify you must order two tickets to the performance and you will only be charged for one full price ticket. Please note that if, for example, you order 7 tickets – 6 will be at half price, but the 7th ticket will be charged at full price – the discount is only offered for pairs of tickets.

50% MONDAYS

All performances scheduled on Mondays during the Cape Town Fringe will be sold at 50% of the full price - these are signified by a green block in the production's performance grid.

If you go and see three Fringe shows on any one day during the Cape Town Fringe, we'll acknowledge your enthusiasm with a free drink at the Fringe Club! PACKAGE DISCOUNTS

FULL HOUSE - these packages have been specially selected for schools and community groups to use as fundraisers. You receive 50% discount on the normal full price if you purchase all the tickets in the venue for a particular show. You can then sell these tickets at the full price (or a price you determine) and your school or organisation benefits from the difference. This makes everyone happy - the artists have a sold out show, the audience is treated to a production they may otherwise not have gone to see, and your organisation reaps the funding benefit! Additional performances (over and above the advertised performances) will be scheduled to accommodate Full House performances. Dates and times for these performances will be arranged to your preferences pending venue and artists' availability. We, The Transposed is an installation work by Darkroom Contemporary Dance Theatre in collaboration with Swiss South African sound artist Mischa Mathys. 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


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
