Welcome to Kalopanayiotis

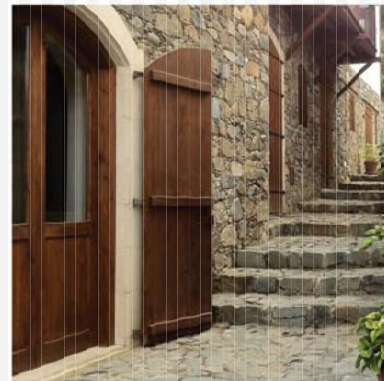
Perched on the steep incline of the Marathasa valley in the northern Troodos mountains, Kalopanayiotis is one of the most picturesque villages in Cyprus, surrounded by vineyards, orchards and pine forests. This ancient spa village is famous for its natural healing sulphur springs and the fresco-covered monastery of St John Lampadistis, a UNESCO world heritage site.

Pilgrims and travellers down the ages from the time of the ancient Kings of Soli have stopped to bathe in these waters, and the Apostle Paul is said to have baptised the first ever bishop of Cyprus here on his journey to Paphos.

We welcome you to join these renowned visitors and discover for yourself the ancient traditions and natural beauty of Kalopanayiotis.

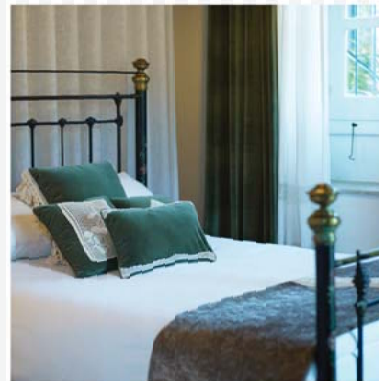

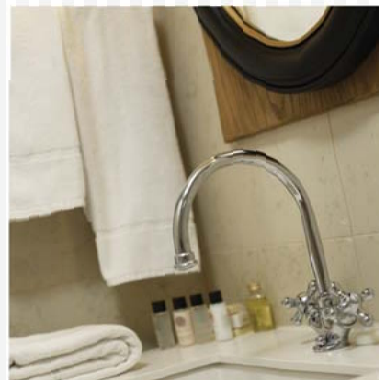




Discover tradition

Every one of our guest rooms were once village homes and have been lovingly restored to the highest specification so that each has its unique style and character. Studios and suites at Casale Panayiotis are therefore situated around the old village neighbourhood, just a few steps away from the communal dining, spa and lounge areas.

Every room retains original features wherever possible, such as stone walls, wooden beams or alcoves, and is furnished with antiques and Cypriot handicrafts in the traditional style, such as handmade crochet-curtains, cushion-covers and bed-spreads. All rooms are en-suite or have a private bathroom or shower-room. Many rooms boast a fireplace.

Comfort Studio

Individually furnished with authentic Cypriot handicrafts, Comfort Studio rooms feature a double bed and en suite shower room. A cosy and charming option.

Superior Studio

Stylishly decorated in the traditional Cypriot manner, Superior Studios are more pleasingly situated than Comfort Studios, many with more spacious accommodation and lovely views.

Comfort One-Bedroom Suite

Traditionally decorated in the Cypriot style with authentic Cypriot handicrafts and benefitting from a separate bedroom and living area and private shower room.

Superior One-Bedroom Suite

Byzantino

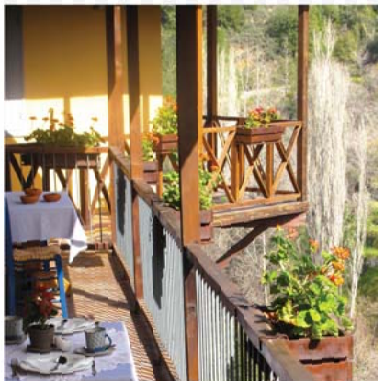

Epikentro

Epikentro serves teas, coffees and desserts. A full, traditional breakfast is served here daily for hotel residents. Try our speciality jams prepared with fresh fruits from our estate, or our mountain tea, made from local herbs. On sunny afternoons enjoy a Cypriot coffee on the balcony overlooking the medieval monastery, or relax with a book in the courtyard. The library-lounge “Archontiko” located adjacent to the open courtyard is a traditional village house that has been transformed into a peaceful sanctuary where you can read your book or enjoy a pre-dinner drink with friends.

Pantheon

Pantheon café serves drinks, crepes, waffles and light meals. Situated a few hundred metres from reception on the upper village road, it is patronised by locals and visitors alike and benefits from magnificent views across the valley.

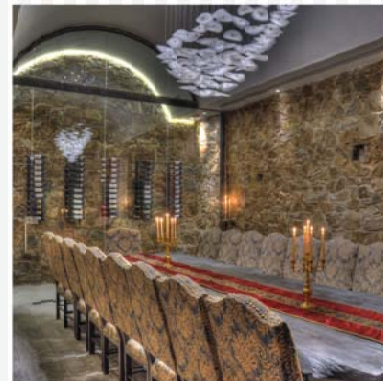

Breathing new life...

Casale Panayiotis is the vision of civil engineer, John Papadouris, now Mukhtar (Mayor) of Kalopanayiotis village. Like many young men growing up in Cyprus in the 1950s, Papadouris went abroad in search of better prospects.

On his return to his village of birth some 40 years later, he determined to breathe new life into the area. Papadouris used his love of his birthplace and his business acumen to accomplish this, and along with both private and EU funds has brought about the revitalisation of a village in decline. Homeowners have been inspired to refurbish their homes, letting rooms and setting up guesthouses with Casale Panayiotis managing the bookings for many of them.

New business enterprises are being set up, bringing life back into the beautiful village with its cobbled streets and ancient traditions. A museum next to the Monastery of St John Lampadistis is full of priceless, inscribed Byzantine art and artefacts.

Kalopanayiotis was a famous ancient spa village where Roman, Byzantine and Frank visitors would bathe in the healing sulphur springs of the Setrachos River and visit the mystical ancient 11th century monastery. Kalopanayiotis is quickly reclaiming its name as a Cyprus treasure and now the template of this rebirth is spreading to nearby villages.





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
