What to see & do at Mokore Ranch!







Visit the "Big Baobab"

S 20 23' 59.41", E 32 6' 49.98"

Mokore Ranch is home to the biggest baobab in Zimbabwe as well as being the 8th biggest in the world!

Bush Breakfast

B-Section - S 20 20' 22.17", E 32 5' 19.17"

Treat yourselves to a hearty brekkie in the bush! (Note: due to Mokore being in a wildlife area, please pay extra attention to your surroundings to ensure your safety).

Note: There is a \$50.00 charge for Mokore host this activity.

Hippos at Majehwe

S 20 24'34.14", E 32 3' 13.7"

We have a family pod of Hippos living at Majehwe; pop across to view them sunning themselves on a sand bank or wallowing in the Turgwe River.

Sundowner Gomo

S 20 23' 54.97", E 32 5' 14.68"

Take in the breath-taking view of the Mokore Ranch from our Sundowner Gomo.

Hollow Baobab

S 20 23' 33.01", E 32 2' 50.92"

A view from the inside; we have a baobab tree which is completely hollow in the middle, allowing you to jump inside.



Bush Dinner at B-Section

S 20 20' 15.47", E 32 5' 31.31"

A night out on the "wild" side; our managers can host a memorable dinner in the bush during your stay. (Note: due to Mokore being in a wildlife area, please pay extra attention to your surroundings to ensure your safety). Note: There is a \$50.00 charge for Mokore to host this activity.

Bush Braai in the River Bed

Chigotsi - S 20 21' 43.83", E 32 6' 30.25" Rot's Spot - S 20 21' 47.97", E 32 6' 46.88" Gwezi Flycamp - S 20 24' 5.17", E 32 6' 28.50"

There is nothing better than a good ol' braai under the stars! Treat yourself to a bush braai in one of the riverbeds on Mokore Ranch. (Note: due to Mokore being in a wildlife area, please pay extra attention to ensure your safety).

Note: There is a \$50.00 charge for Mokore to host this activity.

Umkondo Club House Ruins

S20 19' 29.96", E 32 8' 48.96"

Let your imagination run wild, whilst you take a walk through the remains of the Umkondo Mine Club House.

Crowned Eagle's Nests

S 20 21' 58", E 32 6' 29.49" Less Active - S 20 23' 2.48", E 32 5' 47.5" S 20 22' 51.12", E 32 6' 3.84"

Visit one of Africa's most iconic birds of prey nest sites. You never know you may be lucky enough to see the Crowned Eagles roosting or feeding their young.

Wild Dog Denning Site

Every now and then Mokore Ranch is lucky enough to be a home to a Wild Dog pack who choose a denning site on our property; with that you may stand a chance to see the Wild Dogs up close with their pups! (Note: this activity must be conducted with a Mokore guide and is seasonal).

Umkondo Mine

20 19' 14.13", E 32 8' 58.14"

Visit the remains of the old Copper Mine which Umkondo was home to with options of visiting the mine shaft, the mill and dump.

Jorrum's Tree & Vulture's Nest

S 20 18' 43.92", E 32 6' 34.51"

Visit the tree near where an outstanding tracker lost his life to an Elephant; Jorrum's plaque is nailed to the Baobab Tree.

Vultures started nesting there the year after his plaque was nailed to the tree. Our trackers say the vultures are his spirit.

Swimming in the River

Spend the afternoon on the banks of one of the surrounding rivers, swimming in the shallows of the river and taking in the bush around you. (Ensure there are no crocodiles in the water. DO NOT swim in ANY water more than 18" deep. Also please note that all East-flowing rivers in Zimbabwe contain Bilharzia).

Shona Grave Site

S 20 21' 30.54", E 32 4' 2.61"

This is a historical grave site where the Hari, skull and other remains can be seen.

Shona Ruins on Mokore

S 20 22′ 9″, E 32 6′ 20.99″

Old ruins remaining from the days when the marauding Matabele were a nuisance.

Shona Ruins on Umkondo

S 20 21' 5.39", E 32 6' 14.83"

Old ruins remaining from the days when the marauding Matabele were a nuisance (Bigger than the Mokore ones).







Fishing

Matendere Turn Off - S 20 5' 57.41", E 32 6' 21.19"

Matendere Fishing Spot - S 20 6' 47.76", E 32 5' 14.98"

Head on down to "The Dam" and try your luck at catching your next meal! (Note: This dam is on a neighbouring property which is approximately a 45-60 minute drive from Mokore Main Camp depending on which side you decide to fish from as there are 2 sides. There is also a daily fee for the fishing).

Barble Fishing

S 20 22' 11.39", E 32 7' 15.95"

Spend an afternoon on the bank of the Mokore River trying your luck at catching Barble out of the "Maramba Pond" (Please throw back what you are not going to eat!)

White-Backed Vulture Nest

S 20 23′ 34.35″, E 32 7′ 42.52″

Visit the exquisite nesting sight of the White-Backed Vultures along the Mokore River.

White Rhino Midden

S 20 21' 25.42", E 32 6' 9.95"

This is the midden of a resident White Rhino; on your way past you may be in luck and spot it.

Umkondo Big Baobab

S 20 20' 29.65", E 32 5' 21.57"

If you are a Baobab lover then this is a beautiful one to visit!

Summer Sundowner Spot

S 20 20' 58.63", E 32 5' 50.33"

Sundowners are a must in the bush! This is another stunning spot to enjoy an ice cold beverage whilst enjoying the tranquility of the bush around you!















Majehwe Weir

S 20 24' 39.21", E 32 3' 42.23"

This weir was built by hand. Many people with shovels, hammers and wheelbarrows. The water from here is pumped to the top of a nearby mountain and then gravity fed to all the Mokore water points used by our game. It is also home to a nice pod of hippos, many crocodiles and some wonderful water birds.

African Hawk Eagle Nest s 20 23' 22.6", E 32 5' 58.2"

These majestic birds are great hunters of guinea fowl and small mammals.

Runani Hide

S20 21' 50.27", E 32 3' 5.78"

The Runani Hide is a great place to spend a morning, afternoon or whole day game and bird watching. Hidden between the rocks and Runani Baobab; this hide is the perfect spot to spend game viewing up close.
